# Knowledge of herbs – *Cyperus rotundus Linn*. (Mustaka)

Drug consists of dried rhizomes of Cyperus rotundus Linn.; family Cyperaceae. The plant is distributed throughout the plains of India up to 1800m elevation. It grows in moist areas, rice fields and along water courses.

Scientific classification:-

Kingdom: Plantae Order: Zingiberales Family: Zingiberaceae

Genus: Curcuma Species: amada Description:-

Rhizome clothed with flexuous hair, outer surface dark brown and white inside.


Medicinal Uses:- Carminative, astringent, anti-inflammatory, antirheumatic, hepatoprotective, diuretic,

antipyretic, analgesic, hypotensive, emmenagogue and nervine tonic.

Chemical Constituents:-

 $4\alpha$ , $5\alpha$ , Oxidoeudesm-11-en-3  $\alpha$ -ol, cyperene-1 (a tricyclic sesquiterpene) and cyperene-2 (a bicyclic sesquiterpene hydrocarbon),  $\beta$ -selinene, cyperenone and  $\alpha$ -cyperone

The other essential oil including copadiene, epoxyguaiene rotundone, cyperenol, cyperolone, eugenol, cyperol, isocyperol,  $\alpha$  and  $\beta$ - rotunol, kodusone and isokobusone.



Adulterants/Substitutes

Cyperus amabilis Vahl. C. escilentus Linn., C. Platystilis R. Br. And C. Scariosus R. Br are substituted for C. rotundus.

## Safety aspects:-

The drug traditionally considered to be safe in the dosage mentioned.
